From BSSP (11/24): "The Whale on the NSS slid naturally at some point in the past 24 hours, likely broke into deeper layers, and ran well past the Meeting Trees- estimated D3 [slide](#). There is weakness in the alpine snowpack on some northerly aspects in the alpine..."

From BSSP (12/4): "[A] team got a better look at the natural avalanche that occurred out there around Thanksgiving. It was a solid D3.5 and ran full [track](#) from the level of the Little [Couloir](#) down to the mature tree line."
